



Saturday, September 28th – Trip to Nantucket (weather permitting)

Hi-Speed Ferry:

- 8:15 AM: Departure from Hyannis Terminal (69 South St). Arrive at ticket office for check-in by 7:30 AM. Car-pooling is highly recommended since parking is limited and it's pay-to-park. The port is only about 5 minutes from our hotel.
- 9:15 AM: Arrival in Nantucket
- 3:30 PM: Departure from Nantucket (arrive at Terminal by 3:00).
- 4:30 PM: Arrival back in Hyannis

Van Tour with Barrett's Tours

9:30 - approx. 11.00 AM

We will board the van right at the ferry terminal.

This narrated tour will take in the scenic beauty of the island with its historic and picturesque locations. And where possible, areas that were captured in favorite early 20th c. photographs will be pointed out.

Note: There is no restroom on the van. Use the terminal bathroom on the mainland or on the ferry before arriving in port.

- The Tavern (1 Harbor Square)
- Provisions (3 Harbor Square) take-out sandwiches

Other Things-to-Do on Nantucket:

- Walking tour on your own: Federal St / Broad St / Easy St / Main St which leads to Straight Wharf. We have walking maps for everyone.
- Whaling Museum: includes admission to the Hadwen House (96 Main St). Senior discount available. Each person is responsible for their own ticket. RECOMMENDED! There is a nice lecture to learn the history of the island. Allow 1-2 hrs. You also can take photos from the rooftop.
